## Late Spring May Delay Readiness for Opener

Shawn Donais, DNR Parks and Trails Supervisor acknowledges that the unprecedented late spring will be extremely detrimental to efforts to get ramps and docks ready for use by fishing opener. In an average year there are 50-60 ramps that are damaged enough to be unusable. The DNR normally has six weeks of open water before fishing opener to fix ramps and install docks. Currently, five weeks from opener, it is looking doubtful that all the needed work will be done on time. The DNR will publish a list of sites that are safely usable and will make a best effort to share that with the public. OTC COLA will publish monthly updates in this E-Newsletter.

# DNR Regulations On Hydraulic Jets And Docks

Jerry Wendlandt is the new Aquatic Plant Management Specialist for the southern half of the Northwest Region (including Otter Tail County). There has been a dramatic increase in the illegal use of hydraulic jets in all of the nine counties in this region. This poster addresses the issue of illegal hydraulic jet use.

# **CONSIDERING A** HYDRAUL C JET?

#### Know the rules

- Legal: Blowing away floating surface debris and algae, if lake bottom is not disturbed. No permit is needed.
- Not legal: Using a hydraulic jet in any way that disturbs the lake bottom or uproots aquatic plants. Illegal use of hydraulic jets may result in a citation, restoration order or both from a state conservation officer.

#### Consider fish, water quality and neighbors

- Illegal use: Destroys fish habitat and clouds the water.
- Improper use: Creates mats of vegetation and unnatural sediment berms that reduce enjoyment of the lake.

Hydraulic jet brand names examples include: HydroSweep Pro, Aqua Thruster, Aquasweep and Aqua

# OTC Invites Input On Dock, Lift Ordinance

Otter Tail County invites public input on revisions to dock, lift ordinance

In efforts to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species, Otter Tail County commissioners and members of the county Aquatic Invasive Species Task Force periodically evaluate rules and regulations.

To that end, the county board is planning an open meeting when county residents can provide input on proposed changes to the county's dock and riparian use ordinance.

A riparian zone includes the interface between land and water. All docks, piers, wharves and boat lifts must remain dry for 21 days before being placed in another body of water.

The public hearing will be held at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, June 5, at the County Government Services Center in Fergus Falls. This will be part of the regular county board meeting agenda.

# MN COLA President's Report March 20, 2018

The meeting of MN COLA members was held March 20, 2018 at the Elks Club in Hutchinson, MN. Hosting the meeting was the Lake Marion Improvement District. # **Restore MN DNR Aquatic Invasive Species Grants**

In 2015/2016 the MN DNR made up a budget shortfall by lowering the funding levels for aquatic invasive species grants. In 2017, facing another budget shortfall, the MN DNR zeroed out the AIS grant program entirely.

Rep. Sand Layman has introduced HF 3798 in the House, and Senator Carrie Rudd has introduced SF 3531 which would restore \$400,000 to the local DNR Aquatic Invasive Species Grant program.

These grants are critical to local efforts to keep the public waterways usable for everyone in the state. Lake Associations already contribute millions of dollars to fund AIS education, inspection and management projects to protect the public waters. This work is having an impact and benefits everyone in Minnesota be they direct users of our lakes and rivers, businesses dependent on healthy lake and river ecosystems, or even people who drink water or pay property taxes. Zebra mussels can damage water plant infrastructure and drive up costs for everyone. Studies have shown that aquatic invasive species can lower property tax base, raising costs for everyone in the taxing district.

Open water is just around the corner, and these grants will help Lake Associations and other local units of government continue to protect our lakes and rivers from Aquatic Invasive Species.
