## 2020 Water Quality Analysis Reports Now Available


Thanks to Lake Associations of the Otter Tail County Coalition of Lake Associations (OTC COLA) the water quality monitoring program for 2020 has successfully been concluded. Analysis of data collected in 2020 has been finalized and results have been compiled and merged with historical data. Tenyear Trend Analysis Reports for the 64 OTC COLA participating Otter Tail County Lakes have been created and are now available. These reports are in the OTC COLA LAKES (2020 SAMPLES) library

In 2017 and 2018, by special grant from the County, OTC COLA sponsored water testing in an additional 102 OTC non-COLA lakes. These reports are included in the <u>Non-COLA Lakes (2019 SAMPLES)</u> library.

## High Stakes For 'State Lakes' Biologist pitches dramatic plan to keep designated sites pristine.

Minnesota has saved its most prized natural landmarks — towering old growth pines, dramatic waterfalls, pockets of native prairie — by protecting them within the state parks system.

Yet the water bodies that define the Land of 10,000 Lakes face the most immediate threats from warmer temperatures and invasive species. Aquatic biologist Peter Sorensen is floating an idea to protect Minnesota's true gems: the state's lakes.

These include publishing an E-Newsletter, hosting a website, using social media and conducting Member meetings. Many Lake Associations also may publish annual Lake Property Owner Directories. E-Newsletters (Electronic Newsletters) in the form of emails are one of the most popular methods used by COLAs and Lake Associations. E-Newsletters usually require relatively shorter development time, less technical expertise, lower total cost and are the most universally accepted electronic media form. They are flexibly adaptable to reproduce in multiple formats including emails, pdf files and paper.

## Riverfront Land Ownership To Be Reviewed As Pelican Dam Project Gears Up

The dam project will remove much of the existing dam structure and replace it with a natural "rock rapids" installation. City council members and citizens raised a number of concerns. Foremost were concerns that the dam was an integral part of the Pelican city landscape, and its loss would change the character of the community.
