2021 Water Quality Analysis E-Reports Are Published!

The OTC COLA water quality sampling and analysis program has provided valuable data to lake property owners for over 20 years. 49 OTC COLA Members participated in the program. 60 Otter Tail County lakes were included in the 2021 program covering over 70% of Otter Tail County lake acreage. 136 volunteers from the lakes were an important component of the program collecting samples from 68 sites and ensuring that the samples were delivered to RMB Laboratories (RMB) in Detroit Lakes, MN. New features have been added for the 2021 reports.

2022 Ag-Urban Partnership Forum On Water Quality Tuesday, January 18, 2022 9:00 a.m. – Noon | Webex webinar


What: An annual conversation on the ways that agriculture and urban partners are working together to improve water quality around Minnesota. This builds off the <u>inaugural event</u> in 2019 that sparked new partnerships in the Minnesota River Basin, and explores ways to keep the conversation – and the partnerships – going, both within and beyond this basin. A <u>second forum</u> was held virtually in 2020 where discussions continued on ways to work together to protect Minnesota waters, including water quality trading between point and non-point sources.

Who should attend: Ag and urban partners looking for ideas and information on how to develop and strengthen their relationships for working together to improve the water quality of Minnesota lakes and streams. These partners include elected officials, municipal employees, producers, Tribal leaders, commodity groups, watershed professionals, advocacy groups, lake associations and private citizens.

AIS Task Force Update- December 2021

Merry Christmas! Long cold nights tell us winter is here in Otter Tail County. A few updates:

I am preparing Otter Tail County's 2021 AIS Prevention Program Summary. It provides an overview of our activities through the year; ranging from our Watercraft Inspection Program (over 12,000 watercraft inspected) to our cooperative bait bag project (50,000 bait bags distributed to bait shops across the county), the Governor's Fishing Opener, the Rinse Station Pilot at Miller Park, and more. Watch this newsletter and the County website in January when the summary is complete.

Meanwhile, preparations begin for the 2022 season. We are coordinating with our advertising partners for our 2022 education and awareness campaign, contacting inspectors about returning for the season, planning additional watercraft rinse stations, and more. Renewable Energy Ordinance Approved by Board Commissioners


A final draft of the Renewable Energy Ordinance was approved by the Otter Tail County Board of Directors on November 23, 2021. The Ordinance became effective December 1, 2021

The ordinance revised the existing Wind Energy Conversion Systems ordinance to include provisions for solar energy systems. As a result, the name needed to be altered to be more comprehensive.

Key Water Quality Monitored Using Satellite Imagery

With more than 12,000 lakes Minnesota has too many lakes to monitor by conventional ground-based sampling. But, satellite remote sensing can.

The <u>Minnesota LakeBrowser</u> is an online interactive lake water clarity/quality tool with Landsat-derived classifications of lake clarity of more than 10,500 lakes measured 11 times from 1975-2018. It also includes searchable statewide maps of chlorophyll concentrations and chromophoric dissolved organic matter (CDOM) levels for several recent years. The chlorophyll classifications are based on the European Sentinel-2 satellites.

No need to search maps for your lake.

Click on the desired lake report in the OTC COLA <u>Water Quality Analysis</u> <u>Reports library</u> to bring up the Report. Click on the UMN LakeBrowser link in the Report to go directly to your lake in the UMN LakeBrowser. <u>Questions?</u>

Infested Waters List

The DNR will add a lake, river, pond or wetland to the infested waters list if it contains an aquatic invasive species that could spread to other waters. The DNR may also list a lake, river, pond or wetland as infested if it is connected to a body of water where an aquatic invasive species is present.

To reduce the risk of spreading aquatic invasive species, activities like bait harvest and water use are managed differently in infested waters.
